South Africa has its own charm, which many find irresistible. It is the cradle of humanity, and when you arrive here, you may well feel that you are "at home."

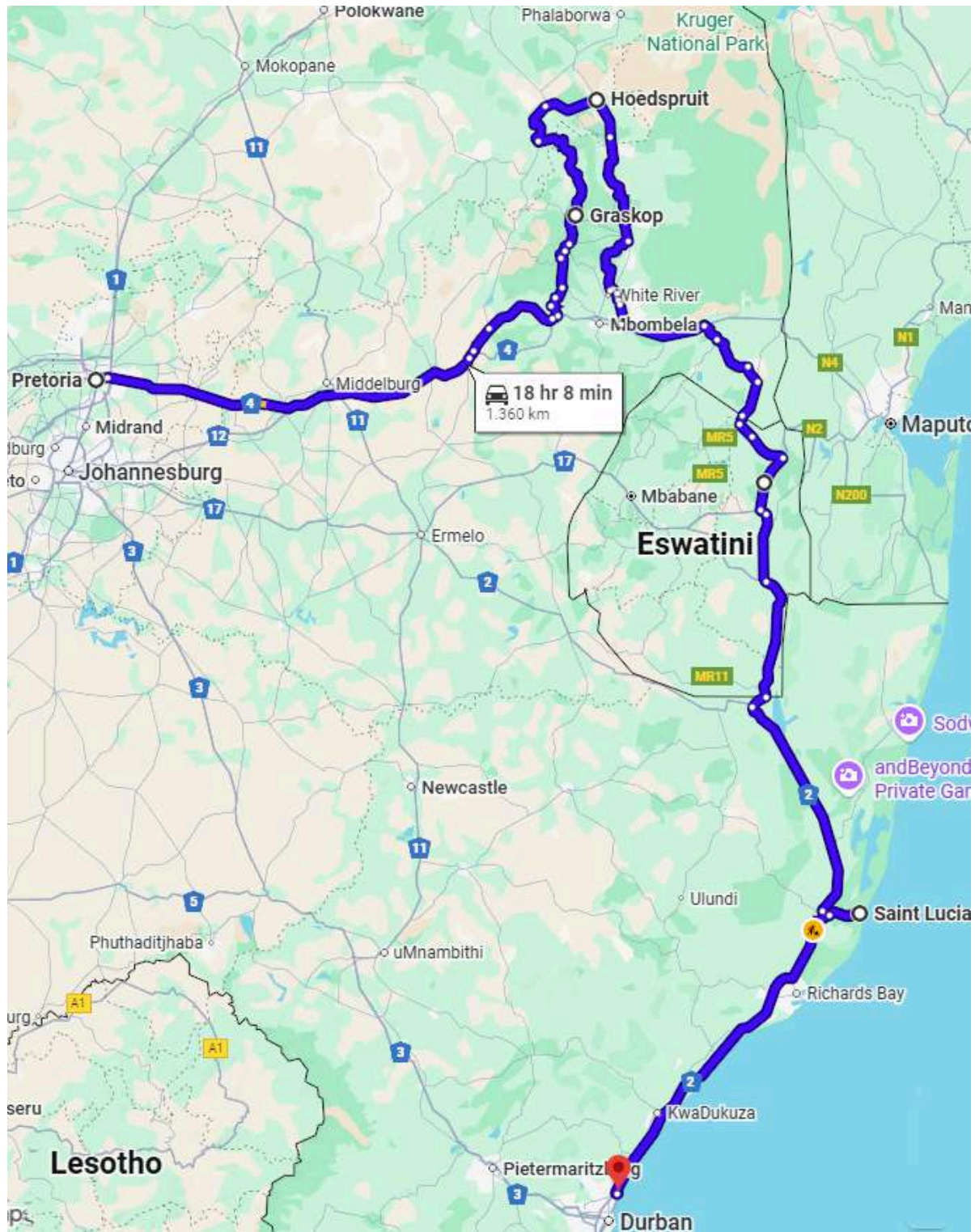
The itinerary will take you from the north to the utmost south.

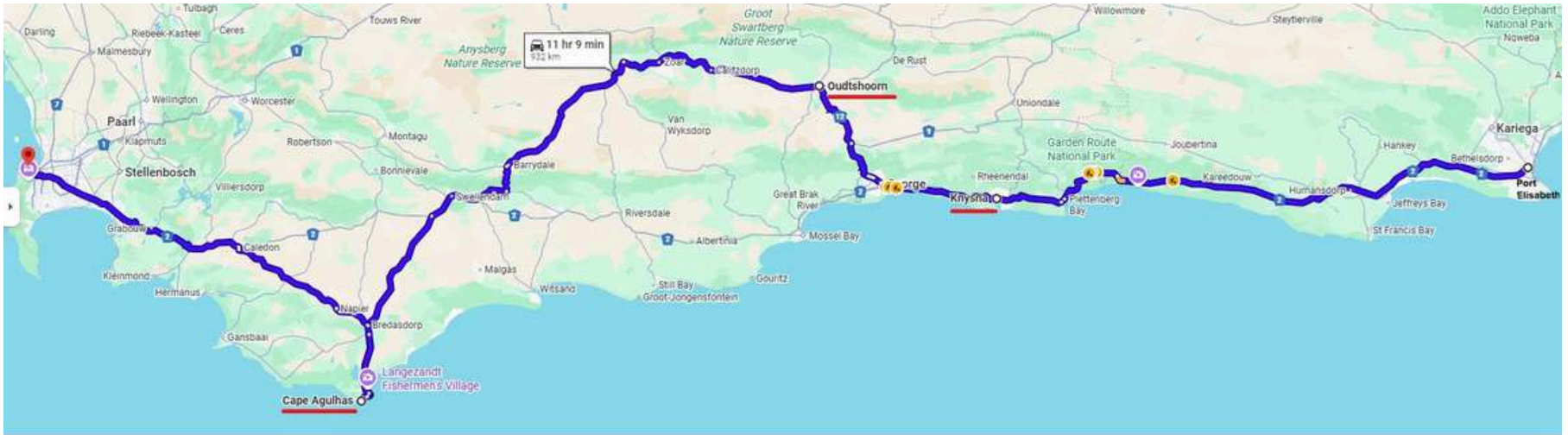

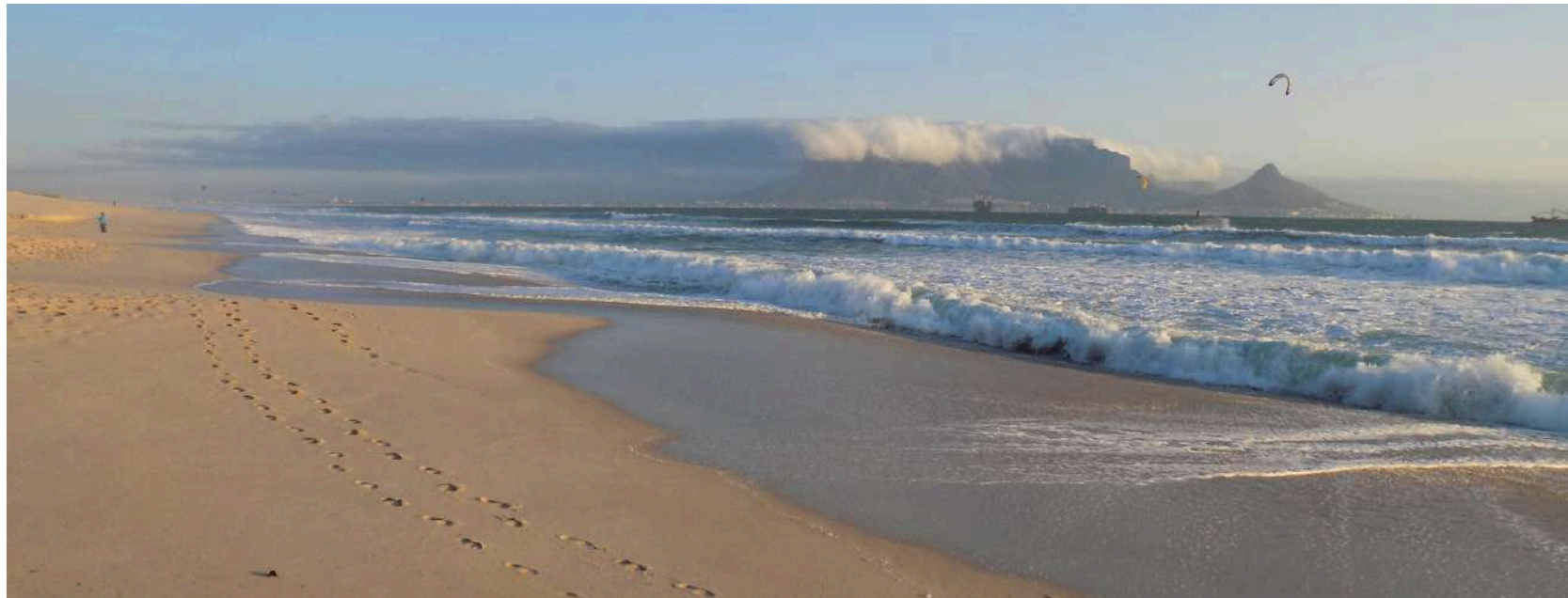

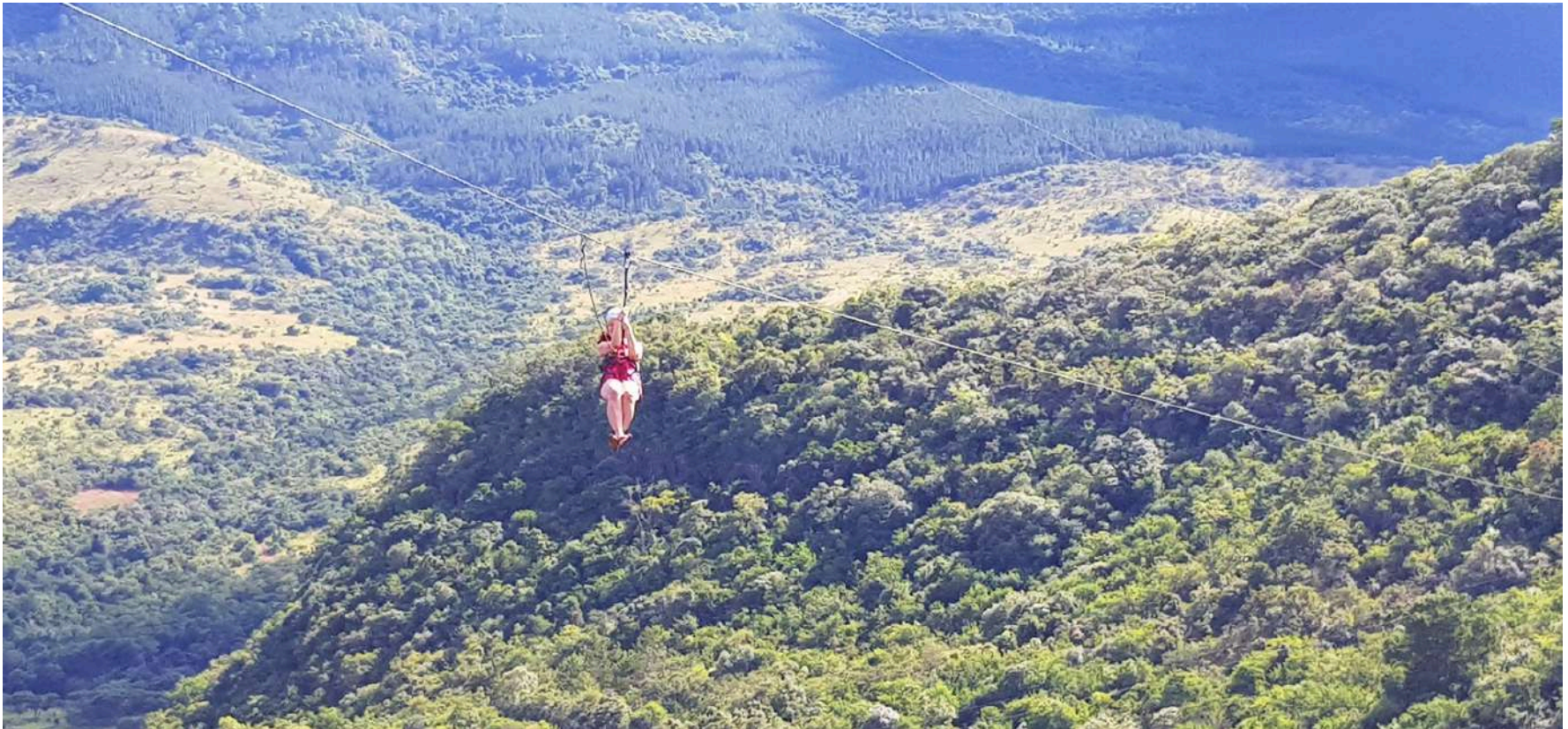


We will visit the Union Buildings and then move to the hotel, where we can relax after a long flight, perhaps by the pool. And, of course, for those interested, a real African steak!

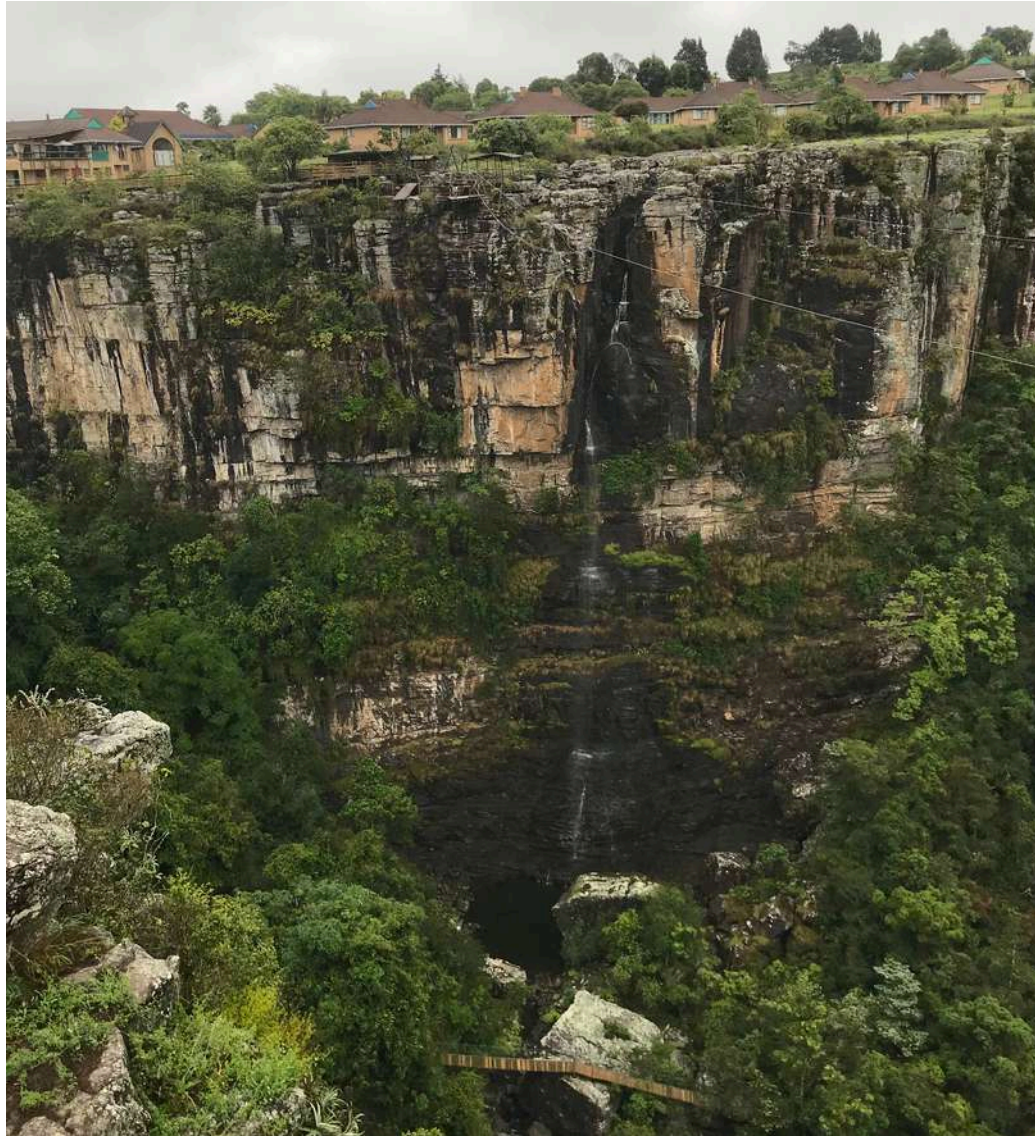
Day 2 - Sudwala Caves and Graskop

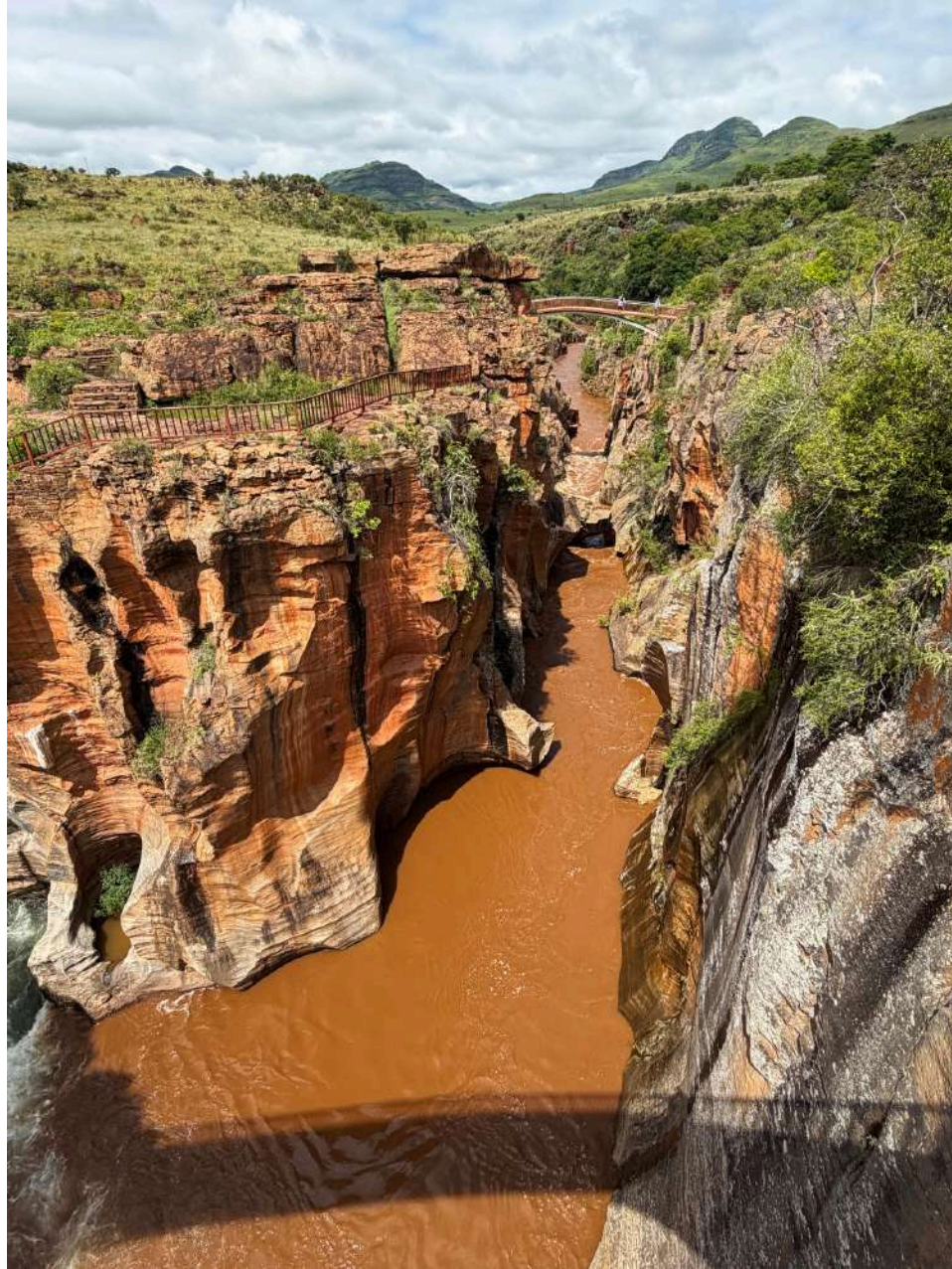

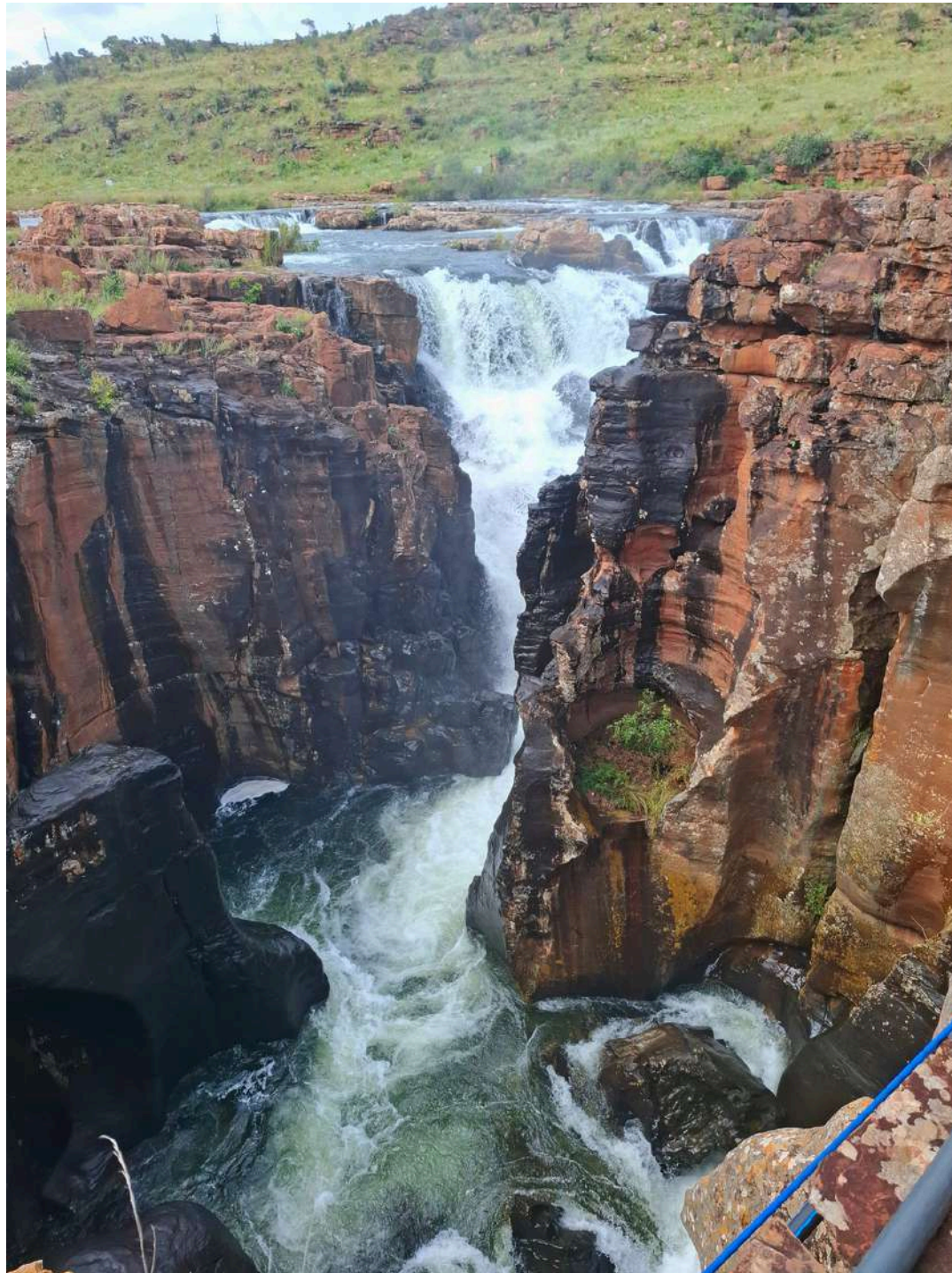

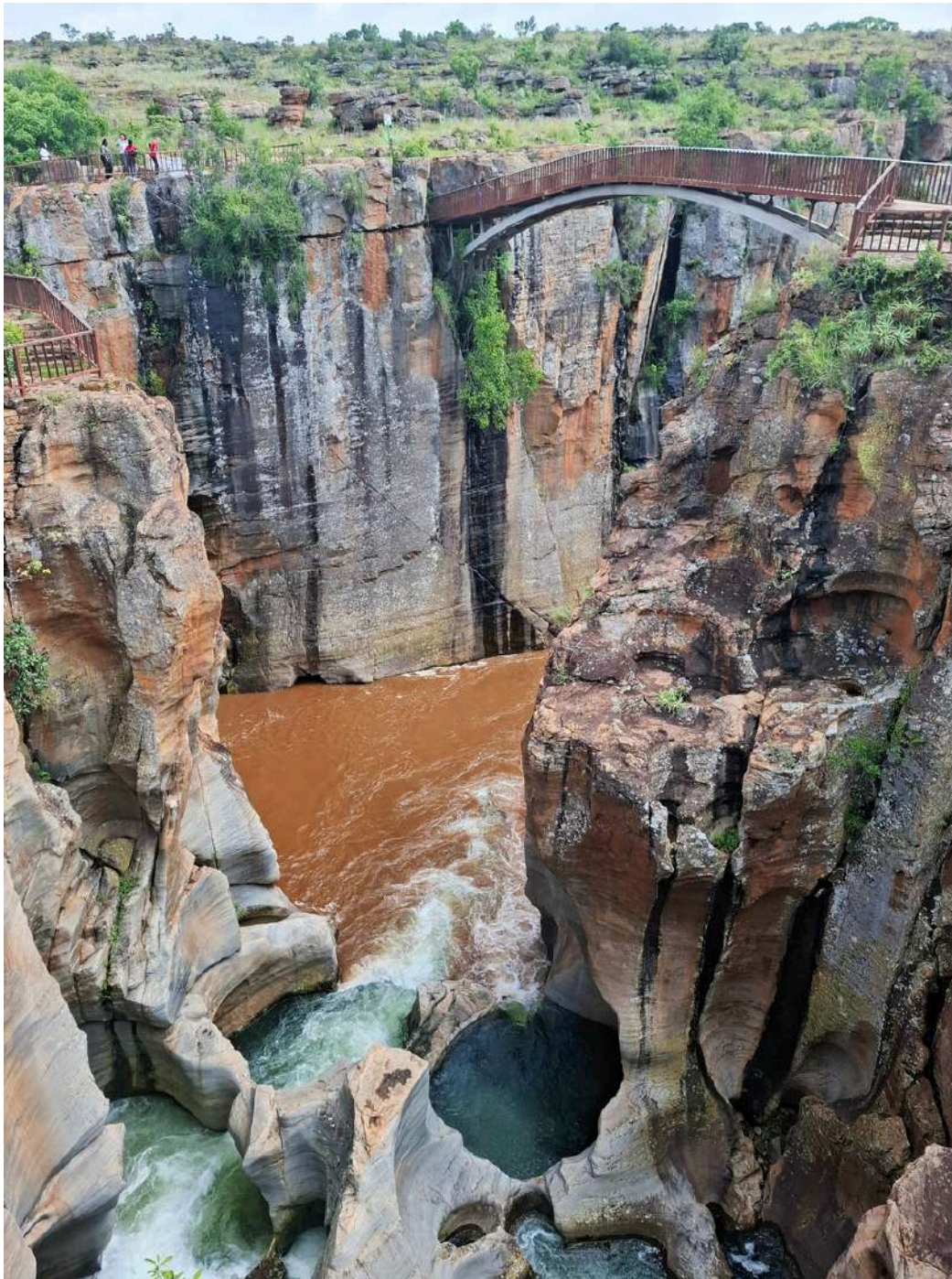


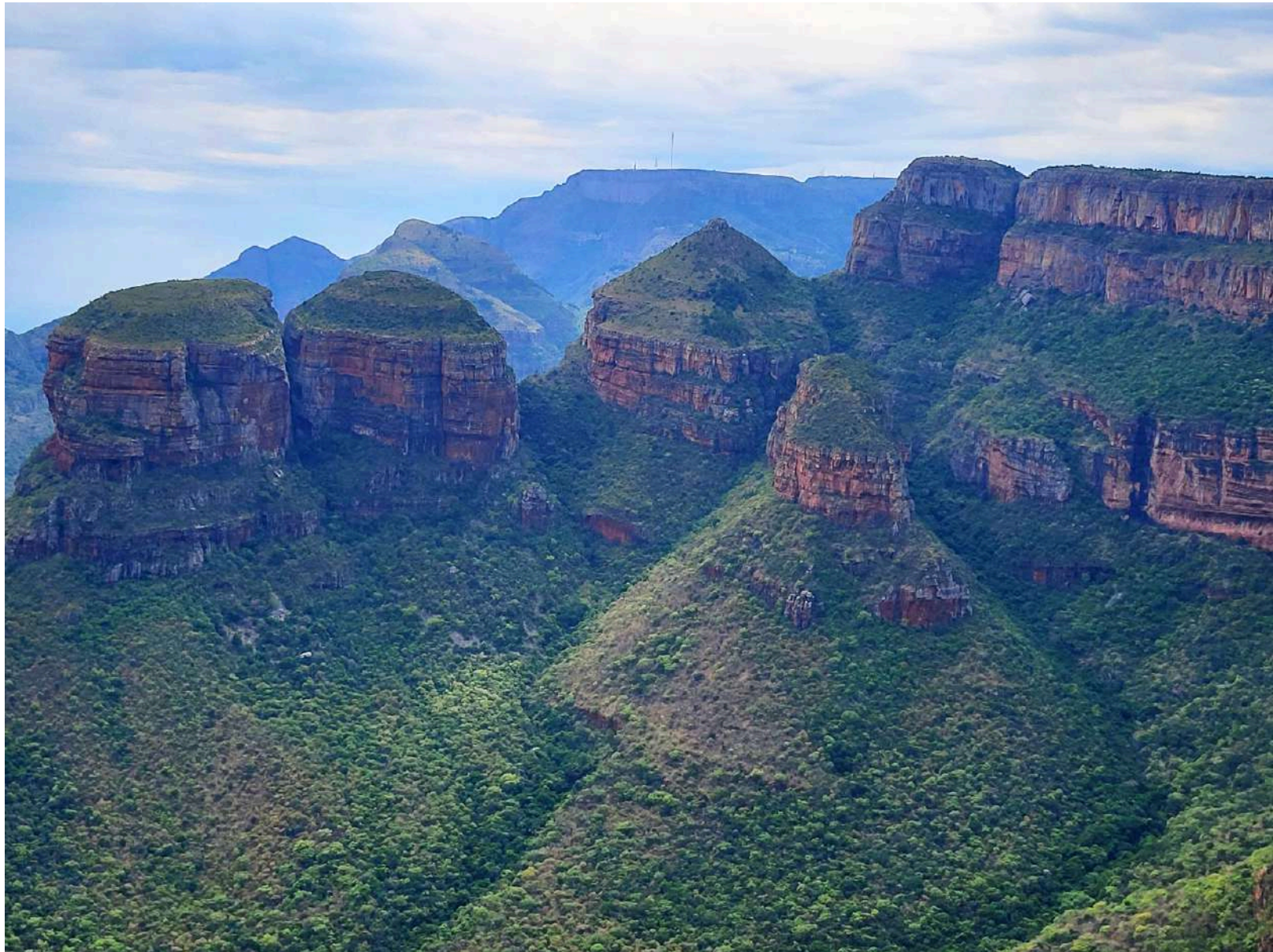

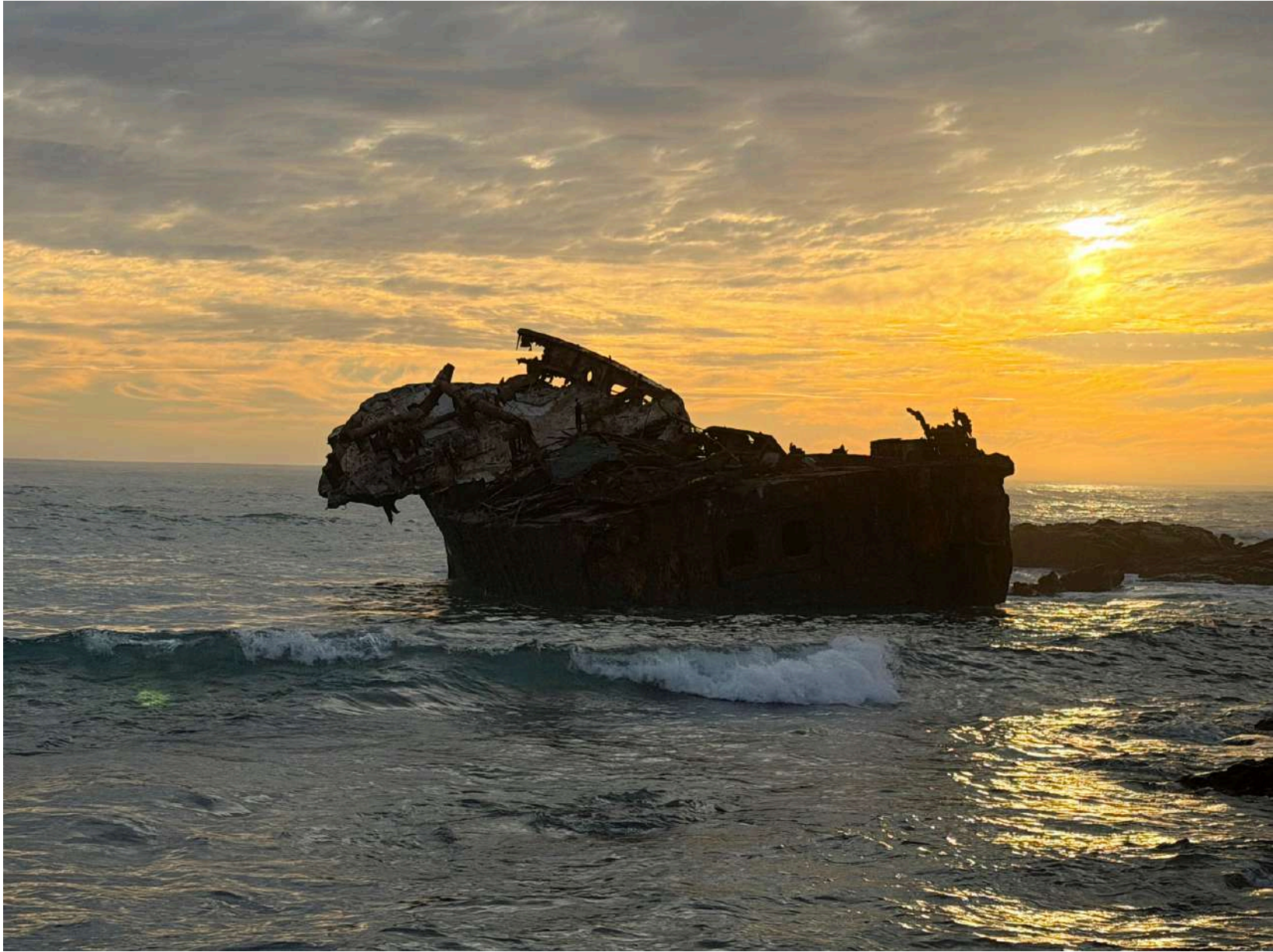
